17 <sup>th</sup> April	<b>Service</b> 		<p>Article 5: Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents and carers to provide guidance and direction to their child as they grow up, so that they fully enjoy their rights. This must be done in a way that recognises the child's increasing capacity to make their own choices.</p>
24 <sup>th</sup> April	<b>Hope</b> 		<p>Article 29: (goals of Education) Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures and the environment.</p>
1 <sup>st</sup> May	<b>Friendship</b> 		<p>Article 13: Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights.</p>
8 <sup>th</sup> May	<b>Perseverance</b> 		<p>Article 3: The best interests of the child must be a top priority in all things that affect children.</p>
15 <sup>th</sup> May	<b>Christian Aid Week</b> 		<p>Article 27: Every child has the right to a standard of living that is good enough to meet their physical, social and mental needs. Governments must help families who cannot afford to provide this.</p>
22 <sup>nd</sup> May	<b>Justice</b> 		<p><u>Article 40</u> A child accused of breaking the law must be treated with dignity and respect. They have the right to help from a lawyer and a fair trial that takes account of their age or situation. The Child's privacy must be respected at all times.</p>
