Attendance

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence by Sefton Council. We hope that by working together, their attendance will improve and they will achieve their full potential in school. The Government are also monitoring poor attendance and have worked with the NHS to produce this document: Is my child too ill for school? Please follow the link for details – this is also accessible on our school website.

We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96%. Our Year 5 and Year 1 class had the highest attendance for last week (3 days) 100%. Other classes attendance was follows: R - 97.6%, Y2 - 96.9%, N - 96.7%, Y3 - 96.6% Y4 - 96.3%, Y6 - 95.2%.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.

Parents can notify school of their child's absence through the School Spider App. You will need to log into School Spider to do this, if you need help logging in, please let school know.
