#### **Attendance**

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. There is now a bigger <u>Government drive to improve attendance</u>.

When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school <u>website</u>.

We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% attendance. Year 5 had the highest attendance for the week before half term - 97.7% attendance, congratulations! Other classes attendance was follows: Y2 - 95.3%, Y1 - 95.2%, R - 94.5%, Y4 - 94.2%, Y3 - 94%, N - 90.1%, Y6 - 89.2%. The highest class attendance for last half term was Year 2.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.


