Attendance

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. There is now a bigger <u>Government drive to improve attendance</u>.

When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school website.

We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% attendance. Reception had the highest attendance for last week – 99.3%, congratulations! Other classes attendance was follows: Y2 - 98.9%, Y3 & Y5 - 97.3%, Y6 - 96.2%, Y1 - 93.4%, Y4 - 92.1%, N - 91%.
