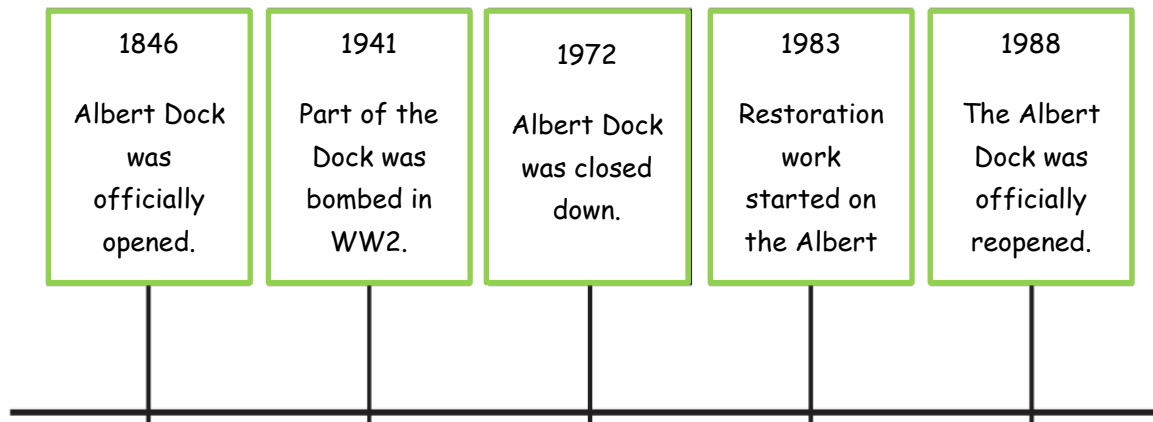
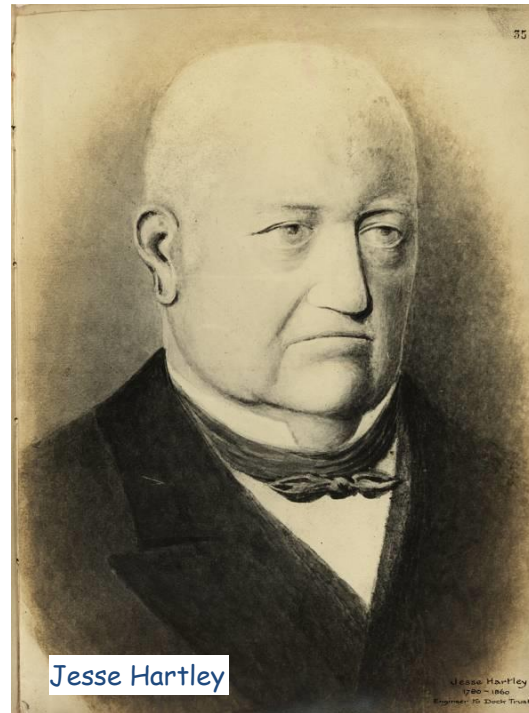

| - Warehouse | A large building where materials or cargo can be stored. |
| - Cargo | The goods carried by ships. |
| - River Mersey | The famous river in Liverpool. |
| - Construction | The action of building something. |
| - Journey | Travelling from one place to another. |
| - Shipwreck | A broken ship that sinks into the water. |
| - Ocean | A large body of water. |
