Attendance

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school website. We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96%.

Our Year 2 class had the highest attendance last week and have knocked Reception class off the top spot, well done Year 2 with 98.8% attendance! Other classes attendance was follows: Y5 - 98.7%, Y3 - 96%, R - 95.4%, Y4 - 95.2%, N - 94.9%, Y6 - 93%, Y1 - 91.7%.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.

Parents can notify school of their child's absence through the School Spider App. You will need to log into School Spider to do this, if you need help logging in, please let school know.

If you are unable to call school, e.g no credit on your phone, please use School Spider.

Be in to win!

Thank you to all families who supported the 'Be in to Win' event for November. Last November we had 82 children in for the whole month. This November we had 147! A staggering improvement, so well done everyone! It was so successful we are trying again this month – the children are really keen to earn themselves a selection box on the last day of term.

Same rules apply: **Every child** who is **in school** for the **whole of December** will receive a **selection box on the last day of term – 22nd December.** They **MUST** be in school every day for both morning and afternoon sessions to win the advent calendar – not off with a valid reason, but in every day. We will see if we can get as many children as possible to attend school every day this month. If your child has an appointment they must come to school prior to present and get their mark and return to school straight after.

School Meal Price Increase from January 2024

Unfortunately, Sefton have miscalculated their costs and are now claiming back over £6,000 which we have not budgeted for. As you can imagine we are as annoyed and as disappointed as you are about the increase in costs and will be doing all we can to fight this. However, it does mean we will have to increase the school meal costs again from 8th January 2024 to £2.50 per day.

Christmas Trees

We have two real Christmas trees which are available to families if you would like them, one is 6 ft and the other 8ft. These need to be collected on Friday 22nd December. Please get in touch with school if you would like a tree.
