Attendance

You have 190 days to come to school and 175 to do everything else!

Regular attendance at school is significant to a child's educational development and progress. There is now a bigger <u>Government drive to improve attendance</u>. When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. The school's policy for attendance is available on the school <u>website</u>.

We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% attendance. Year 5 and 4 had the highest attendance for last week – 98.9%. Other class attendance was as follows: Y6 - 98.7%, R - 95.7%, Y2 - 95.6%, Y1 - 94.6%, Y3 - 93.8%, N - 89.6%.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.

You will need to log into School Spider to do this, if you need help logging in, please let school know.

Transition Morning

As the children will be waiting to hear who their new teacher is and wanting to visit their new class we will be holding a transition morning on Thursday June 27th. This is the day all Year 6 pupils will be visiting their new high school. All pupils from Reception to Year 5 will line up at 8.45am as they will in their new classes.

Year 1 will go to Year 2 classroom door and be greeted by Mrs Wignall (Year 2 teacher)

Year 2 will go to the junior playground and line up outside the first junior door with the current Year 3 and be greeted by Miss Ledgerton (Year 3 teacher)

Year 3 will line up outside the same door but in Year 4 place and be greeted by Mrs Clarke (Year 4 teacher)

Year 4 will go to the next junior door and be greeted by Mr King (Year 5 class teacher)

Year 5 will go to the same door but in Year 6 place and be greeted by Mrs Lees and Miss Lockett (Year 6 teachers)

Nursery Places 2024-2025

We are currently organising our nursery places for the next academic year and providing our new starters the opportunity to visit nursery before the end of the school year.

Morning places usually fill up quickly, so early application is important to secure the place that you prefer. We offer morning sessions 8.30am -11.30am, afternoon sessions 12.15pm - 3.15pm and 30 hour places for working parents.
