Attendance

Other class attendance was as follows: Y1 - 100%, Y2 & Y3 - 97.41%, N & Y4 - 97.32%, Y% 96.88%, R – 96.77% and Y6 96.25%

The classes in **green** are above our target of **96%** and those in **red** are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance. All classes were above our target last week this is great news and hopefully will continue.

Wear it Wild

During their PSHE lessons, Year 3 were learning about different charities and decided that they would like to raise money for the World Wildlife Fund as they were shocked and saddened by the number of endangered animals on our planet. They decided to hold a sponsored silence on the 31st March for two hours to raise money for the WWF and succeeded in raising over £300!

Year 3 wanted to do more to help so asked if they could hold a 'Wear it Wild Day' on the 2nd May with the school dressing in wildlife themed clothing and donating £1. All donations would be welcome no matter how big or small.

They will be sharing what they have learnt and to find out about the endangered species that live in the Cayman Islands like the Cayman turtles and blue iguana.
