### Attendance

Last year we had a huge drive to improve attendance. This is a shared objective in schools across the country and in Sefton. **'You can't teach an empty chair.'** 

St. Oswald's own message is:

# 'You have 190 days to come to school and 175 to do everything else!'

We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. Please click on the <u>link</u> to see the guidance for parents regarding attendance: We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% or better attendance. Congratulations to our Nursery class who had the highest attendance for the last week - Well done again to Year 1 with 100% attendance! Other class attendance was as follows: Y4 -99.64%, Y2 - , 8.28%, Y6 - 97.33%, Y5 - 95.38%, N - 92.83%, R - 90%, Y3 - 87.59%.

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance. All classes were above our target last week this is great news and hopefully will continue.

### **Nursery Admissions**

Do you have a child that will be turning 3 before July 2026? Mrs Gall is organising spaces in our nursery class for the next academic year. Application forms are available from the school office or can be downloaded <u>here</u>. We will also need to see your child's birth certificate with their application form.

From September 2025 we are offering a variety of sessions -

- 5 mornings a week (8.30am-11.30am)
- 5 afternoons a week (12.15pm-3.15pm),
- beginning of the week (full days Monday & Tuesday plus Wednesday morning)\*
- end of the week (Wednesday afternoon and full days Thursday & Friday)\*
- 30 hour sessions (4 1/2 days with the option to pay for an extra session to make 5 full days)

\*There will be a charge for beginning of the week and end of the week sessions.

Please ensure that you apply for your child's nursery place early to get the sessions that you want. Parents are encouraged to visit our new *Early Years Unit* and can arrange a visit through the school office.

Please do come along to our sculpture exhibition this evening – weather permitting this will be held on KS1 playground, or in the hall if wet. The school building will not be open as we had threats made by a parent last year so have restricted full access for the safety of all.

### **Transition Morning Tomorrow**

Tomorrow morning, every class will be going to the class they will be in next year. For Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 they will go straight to classroom doors of those classes from 8.45am and be met by their new teachers for September.

For Year 2 moving to Year 3 they will need to go onto the junior playground and line up by the first door next to the main front gates at 8.45am, Miss Ledgerton will be there to greet them. The rest of Key stage 2 will just move along to the next line and go into their new classroom and meet their new teachers.

It is important that all the children are in school this day as this will give them the opportunity to work in their new classrooms and get to know their new staff a little better before starting in

September, this will particularly help those children who are anxious about change or their new class.
