When a child's attendance falls to 90% or below it is classed as persistent absence. We hope that by working together, attendance will improve and children will achieve fully in school. We reward good attendance each week and are aiming for at least 96% attendance. Class attendance for the first week back was as follows: Year 2 - 100%, Year 4 - 98%, Reception – 95%, Year 1 -93.87%, Year 6 93.85%, Nursery 93.18%, Year 3 91.43%, Year 5 - 90% Overall school attendance – 95.88%

The classes in green are above our target of **96%** and those in red are below, some significantly below. We will be targeting those with poor attendance.

### **Summer Reading Challenge**

#### **Tax Free Childcare Account and Universal Credit Parents**

Breakfast club fees can be paid directly to Sefton Council (school) via parent's Tax Free Childcare Account. You can use it to pay for approved childcare, for example:

- · Childminders, nurseries and nannies
  - After school clubs and play schemes

Your childcare provider must be signed up to the scheme before you can pay them and benefit from Tax-Free Childcare.

Universal Credit claimants can receive a contribution towards <u>wraparound childcare costs</u> to help them work or look for work, by claiming the <u>Universal Credit Childcare Costs</u> element. You must pay for the childcare yourself, then claim the costs back from Universal Credit, which will pay you back up to 85% of the amount in the same assessment period or the next if reported late. You must report your childcare costs on your monthly statement, and there is a cap on the amount you can claim, currently up to £1,031.88 for one child and £1,768.94 for two or more children.


### **CAMHS**
